

# Get online not in line



Congratulations on the purchase of your new vehicle. You may be able to skip the line at the DMV by registering online at [dmv.nv.gov/edrs](http://dmv.nv.gov/edrs). You can transfer your current license plates or get new standard plates by mail. It's quick, easy and, best of all, no lines!

## Qualifications

Use the DMV's online registration if all of the following apply:

- The Electronic Dealer, Rebuilder or Lessor's Report of Sale or Lease (EDRS) has printed below the logo "This vehicle may qualify for online registration."
- The EDRS lists your valid Nevada Driver's License Number for individuals or a Federal Employer Identification Number for businesses.
- The dealer has issued a valid Emissions Vehicle Inspection Report (when needed).
- You have obtained Nevada insurance on the vehicle from a company licensed in Nevada.

## How It Works

- Have your EDRS and Nevada Evidence of Insurance card ready, log on to [dmv.nv.gov/edrs](http://dmv.nv.gov/edrs) and click *Register Online – Get Started*. You have the option to create a MyDMV account to access all of your driver license and vehicle registration records in one place.
- You may pay registration fees by e-check, debit or credit card. Veterans exemptions are accepted.
- To transfer plates, your name on the EDRS must match the name on the current registration for those plates.
- If you are transferring plates, any credit on your existing registration will be applied to the new registration. You may transfer plates up to 18 months after they have expired.
- Your vehicle will be registered immediately upon successful completion. If transferring plates, the registration on your old vehicle is surrendered.
- A temporary permit prints with your receipt. Tape this in the lower right-hand corner of the windshield and keep the receipt in the vehicle.
- Your Registration Certificate and Validation Decal will arrive at the address listed on the EDRS in four to seven days.
- If you are receiving new plates, they will arrive separately in seven to 10 days.

## Limitations

Sorry, but you must register your vehicle in person at a Nevada DMV office if:

- The EDRS does not list a Nevada Driver's License number or FEIN, or the number is incorrect.
- Your name is misspelled or you need to change your address.
- You want to use a tribal or farmer/rancher exemption.
- You want new personalized or specialty license plates.
- You wish to transfer certain license plate styles such as antique or classic vehicles.
- You wish to use credits other than a credit on license plates being transferred.
- Your vehicle is a motor home or trailer.
- Your physical address on your Nevada driver's license on file with the DMV is in Clark or Washoe County and you want to base your vehicle in a different county.
- You currently have a Revenue Recovery case, Insurance Verification sanction, or parking tickets.
- The gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicle is 26,001 pounds or more.
