5. Approval of Agenda Order

A. The Agenda was approved by the committee in the order it was presented.

6. Approval of October 2018 Meeting Minutes:

A. October meeting minutes were approved with 4 grammar corrections. William Striejewske's name was also misspelled on 12B of the record. Note was made for correction. Also, on 14B the name Mark Brown should have been Mark Costa. The Minutes were approved by the committee with these corrections being made.

7. Status Update on Nevada's Allotment of Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Funds.

- A. Joseph Perreira (NDEP); Nov. 5th, NDEP released a press release listing the Mitigation funding awards. The award is 6.6 million dollars to 11 awardees. The projects range from school bus replacements to refuse trucks, transit truck replacements and 140 pieces of airport ground support equipment, located at both McCarran and Reno Tahoe airports. The press release can be found at https://ndep.nv.gov/air/vw-settlement/2018-demf-awards. One award had to be revoked. An agreement with the department of aviation in regards to the contract language could not be met. 5 of the 10 remaining funding requests have been submitted. They are currently awaiting approval from Wilmington Trust. Two more submissions should be happening in the next week or so. Since October we have gotten approval on two of our previously submitted projects for electric vehicle charging Infrastructure in Amagosa Valley and one in Moapa. We have a third project in the works for a charging station as well in Ely, Nevada. Nevada has submitted 11 funding requests to Wilmington Trust, 6 have been approved and 5 are pending approval for the school bus replacement project for the Clark County school bus project, one equipment replacement project for the city of Reno.
- B. **Joseph Perreira (NDEP);** Regarding the Nox reduction project, The funding that has been awarded in this round had a Nox Emission reduction target. It was based on the number of Subject Volkswagen vehicles operating in the state. The calculation models show that we should hit our target.
- C. **Joseph Perreira (NDEP);** At this point the timeline for applications for funding is going to remain the same. June 1st through the end of July, 2019. We are expecting some changes to the application. Nevada is ahead of the curve.

8. Legislative Update

A. Robert Tekniepe (CC/DAQEM); AB1 deals with the state environmental commission. SB42 Dealing with All Fuel Vehicle program. There are several BDRs out there: BDR 226 Cleanup Bill; BDR 360 Changes Public Noticing; BDR 361 Eliminates Requirement for Alternative Fuel Program; BDR 802 & 962 deal with electric vehicles; BDR 88 deal with fleet vehicles; BDR 836 deals with auto emissions.

B. **Sig Jaunarajs (NDEP);** SB42 is a complete repeal of 486A, the alternative fuels and fleets program. In response to both of our largest counties being non-attainment for carbon monoxide ambient air quality standards. So, the legislature was doing everything it could to bring it back into attainment. Since it was started, the program is a little out dated and we are seeking a repeal.

9. Department Regulatory Update - Remote Sensor Testing

- A. Ivie Hatt (DMV/CED) & JD Decker (DMV/CED); the heavy duty Diesel Program is the only mechanism in the state to regulate emissions for vehicles over 14,000 lbs. It's fully up and running. 2 uniformed officers in the south and 1 in the north. There is a lot of cooperation from drivers whose employers are not complying with regulations.
- B. Ivie Hatt (DMV/CED) & JD Decker (DMV/CED); we were approached with a remote sensing technology. The statutory framework already exists. After session is over we will be working on regulations and how it will work in the commercial marketplace. To reiterate, we won't be running it, we are simply setting up the regulatory framework for entities to operate so they can interface the data to verify emissions. Remote sensing is coming and we are going to be on the front end.

Q: Jim Valerio (Parsons); So, it won't be a competitive environment, it will be an environment where any commercial provider of a remote sensor can set up and collect data?

A: JD Decker (DMV/CED); Correct. It would have to be an enterprise large enough to collect the data and configure their systems with ours, or at least provide the data in a format that is compatible with how we collect it. We are not managing or issuing a contract, driving this program we are simply allowing the marketplace to drive it. Through our regulations we are simply saying if you want to engage in this, you will have to do it in this manner.

C. Peter Krueger (Member of the Public); is this Fleet solutions, do they contract with a company?

JD Decker (DMV/CED); the concentration right now is on passenger cars. A vehicle would drive by a remote sensing station, your vehicle registration info and metered results would be sent to us, if you passed, theoretically the next time you get the DMV notice in the mail it would say "Smog Check not required" and it would instruct you to pay only your Registration fees and the sensing fees.

Q: Peter Krueger (Member of the Public); Is this fleets only? Diesel?

A: JD Decker (DMV/CED); This would be potentially everyone. Our current focus is on Gasoline.

10. Informational Items

- A. **Joseph Perreira (NDEP);** as of the close of 2018, Volkswagen has completed the Requirements in regards to installing fixes 2 & 3 liter subject vehicles. Well Ahead of Schedule.
