5. Approval of Agenda Order

6. Approval of October 12, 2021, Meeting Minutes:

A. October 12, 2021, minutes were approved as written by the Committee.

7. Update on Progress Promulgating Regulations Arising from AB-411:

A. **Bill Striejewske (NDOA)** AB-411, from the recently concluded legislature session, approved the use of E15 gasoline in Nevada with an effective date of July 1st, 2022. In October, I reported that we had submitted a file draft to the Legislative Council Bureau and spent the rest of the year finalizing the language on that. For E10 there is a federally recognized 1 PSI vapor pressure waiver that is allowed. States can make up their own rules for the period between September 16th thru May 31st but during the summertime season that 1 PSI is only allowed if there is between 9 and 10 percent ethanol in the fuel. In 2019, the EPA extended the 9 to 10 percent to 9 to 15 percent to allow for the waiver to be extended to E15 gasoline. In July of 2021, the DC Court of Appeals struck down that extension saying that the EPA had overstepped their authority and they do not have the authority to make that proclamation since the existing waiver is part of the Clean Air Act. Only Congress can make that decision. Early in the Fall that was challenged in court by the Renewable Fuels folks and DC Court of Appeals refused to rehear it. Growth Energy has also petitioned the Supreme Court and yesterday the Supreme Court refused to hear it. While all of this was going on we were trying to get our language in place with LCB. This waiver is going to go through at some point and what we wanted was to get the language done for when it does go through, so we did not have to spend months correcting it but unfortunately, we were not able to do that. We did get our draft back on December 30th, 2021, from LCB and in the next week or so we will be sending out our Small Business Impact Survey. This survey will probably be out for a couple of weeks and then we will get to our workshops and hearings. The draft R038-21P can be found in the register on the Legislature's website. I would be happy to answer any questions if anyone has any?
